8th INTERNATIONAL CALLIGRAPHY COMPETITION
DEDICATED TO THE LATE SYRIAN CALLIGRAPHER
M. BADAWI AL-DIRANI**

The Research Centre for Islamic History, Art and Culture (IRCICA) is pleased to announce the results of the Eighth International Calligraphy Competition which is dedicated to the late Syrian Calligrapher Muhammad Badawi al-Dirani (1312-1387 H./1894-1967). The international competition aims to preserve and revive the principles and methods of classical Islamic calligraphy by encouraging the present day and future generations of calligraphers to follow the original principles and common concepts established throughout the ages by the masters of this art, far from the foreign influences which are not in conformity with the traditional concept of Islamic calligraphy. The calligraphy competition is organised periodically once every three years.

H.E. Prof. Ekmeleddin Ihsanoğlu, Honorary Chairman of the Jury, attended some of the meetings of the Jury which took place between 5 - 15 April 2010 at the headquarters of the Centre in the Historical Yıldız Palace, in Istanbul. The sessions continued under the Chairmanship of Mr. Hasan Çelebi and with the participation of following members:

Mr. Muhammed Tamimi, Coordinator of the competition, his assistant Mr. Said Kasımoğlu, and Mrs Özlem Bulut from the Competition Secretariat, assisted the Jury through its working sessions.

Dr. Halit Eren, Director General of IRCICA and Chairman of the Organizing Committee explained the activities undertaken by the Centre and the competition Secretariat during the last three years to implement this competition at an international level. The eighth calligraphy competition was comprised of the following ten styles: jaly thuluth, thuluth, naskh, jaly taliq, taliq, jaly diwani, diwani, qufi, riq'a and maghribi. The Jury was presented with the 969 works, encoded beforehand, submitted by 683 participants from 31 countries. After a selection and evaluation process, the remaining best works were chosen for the final decision. The works were examined from all aspects and those worthy of awards and mentions were selected, as shown in the attached table.

The Jury focused on precision in writing and did not comply with any particular school. This will be reflected clearly in the catalogue of winners' works that will be published. It also took into consideration criteria such as conformity with the rules of calligraphy, performance in writing, creativity of the composition, and observance of the conditions of the competition, disregarding some small deficiencies noticed in some of the relatively good works.

The Jury noticed that the level in jaly taliq style was not as satisfactory as required; and decided to withdraw the first and second awards in this style. The level of some of the works being high in jaly thuluth, thuluth, naskh and diwani styles, the Jury decided to allocate eight incentive prizes, US\$1000 each, for these styles. The results are mentioned in the attached list: 28 awards, 32 mentions and 8 incentive prizes, i.e. a total of 68 awards and mentions amounting to US\$ 126.500 in total, won by 64 participants from 15 countries.

An exhibition of the winners' works will be held at IRCICA's headquarters in Istanbul for a few days; an award ceremony will be organised, and sponsored and hosted, by Abu Dhabi Authority for Culture and Heritage, on 2 June 2010. A catalogue of the winners' works will be published, to be distributed to the winners, and certificates will be presented to them.

M. BADAWĪ al-DĪRANĪ (1312-1387/1894-1967)

Muhammed Badawi al-Dirani, an eminent calligrapher of Syria in the twentieth century, was born in Damascus in 1894. He is called al-Dirani in reference to Daria, a village in the Damascus countryside. He was educated in Quranic schools from his early childhood. He engaged in calligraphy when he was twelve years old. He took lessons from calligrapher Mustafa Siba'i (died in 1919), student of Sahib Qalam (died in 1897), who taught him the rules of ta'liq, a calligraphy style that he later mastered. Then he met calligrapher Yusuf Agah bin Muhammed -known as Rasa- who was sent by Sultan Abdulhamid II to Damascus to write the inscriptions of the Umayyad Mosque after the fire that hit it. Badawi learnt from him the calligraphic styles of diwani, thuluth, naskh and riq'a. For seventeen years Al-Dirani worked in his office of the famous calligrapher Mamdouh al-Sharif, who taught him the rules of kufi and jaly diwani. Later, he opened his own office in al-Bous street, in the Sulaimaniyah district near the Umayyad Mosque.

In the ta'liq style, Badawi developed a style similar to Sahib Qalam's. His style was appreciated by professionals as well as the public, and calligraphers followed his example. He was also distinguished in thuluth, the style of Rasa and Mamduh, but followed the example of calligraphers Shafiq and Aziz al-Rafa'i. He mastered jaly thuluth, as is seen in the inscriptions of the Othman, Rawdha and Thuraya mosques, the Ministry of Justice building and in the People's Assembly building.

Al-Dirani taught calligraphy at Damascus schools, to many prominent calligraphers such as Zuhair Manini, Abdul Razzaq Qusaibati, Othman Taha, Ahmed al-Mufti, Mahmoud al-Hawari etc. He also taught writers and poets including Nizar Qabbani, Dr. Shakir Mustafa, Dr. Najat Qassab Hassan, Yasser al-Malih, among others.

He traveled to Istanbul to see the calligraphic works located there and stayed with the renowned calligrapher Hamid al-Amidi. Al-Dirani also traveled to Alexandria where he was the guest of Mohammed Ibrahim. He then traveled to Cairo where he met calligrapher Muhammed Husni al-Baba and then returned to Istanbul in 1965.

Al-Dirani was a close friend of calligrapher Hashim al-Baghdadi who wrote the epitaph on his tombstone after his death on 25 July 1967.

In 1968 calligrapher Badawi al-Dirani was granted the Syrian Order of Merit of First Class. He left a wide range of excellent calligraphic works in all calligraphy styles, but mostly in ta'liq style.
